The Position

Using individual and group counselling, the Social Worker provides professional clinical services to women who have been involved with the criminal justice system or who are at risk of being involved with that system. You will provide these services at the Newfoundland and Labrador Correctional Centre for Women (NLCCW) and in the community through the Just Us Women's Centre.

What You'll Do

- Completes intake assessments to determine services that would be most helpful for the women and uses these assessments in the development of case plans.
- Provides individual counseling and facilitates therapeutic groups based on the needs of women.
- Refers women to other programs and collaborates with others as required, both within the organization and in the community, with consent from the participants.
- Regularly visits the NLCCW, on a weekly basis when possible, and offers groups and individual counseling as time permits.
- Supports the release planning efforts of women at the NLCCW.
- Networks with other community and institutional staff who support the needs of women with justice issues.
- Mediates conflict and manages crisis situations when they arise and implements appropriate action plans.
- Identifies gaps in service and advocates at the appropriate government or agency level to effect changes.
- Supervises and/or provides training opportunities for students, including Social Work, Psychology and Nursing, on occasion.



What You'll Bring

- Social Work Degree and registered with the Newfoundland & Labrador Association of Social Workers.
- Minimum of 5 years' experience in a mental health work setting including working with the target population of our program.
- In-depth knowledge of broad spectrum of community-based services, organizations and resources.
- Minimum of two years of experience counseling with individuals, especially in women and criminal justice issues.
- Experience in counseling through group methods would be an asset.
- Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Sector Check.
- Enhanced Reliability Status with the Public Services and Procurement Canada.
- Valid driver's license and vehicle are required for this position. Must be insurable on the company vehicle.

The Details

This is a full-time contract position for 1 year. The work involves mostly day shifts, but the position requires flexibility for the Social Worker to stay one night per week in the Clarenville area to provide service to the NLCCW. Stella's Circle offers health and dental, long term disability insurance, life insurance, matching RRSP plan, birthday leave, sick leave, personal leave and three weeks vacation. The salary for this position is \$73,094.29 - \$79,290.41.
